Dear Louise and Joan,

I am writing in response to consultation with Richmondshire District Council with regards to a County Matter as detailed in the subject heading above.

I apologise for missing last week's deadline for consultation, which was due to me being off work sick. I note that you have allowed other consultees an extension of time for their responses to 30th June, 2022 and I hope that you will therefore have regard to the comments made on behalf of Richmondshire District Council set out below:

1. At this stage Richmondshire District Council OBJECTS to the proposals, on grounds of the potential negative impacts on highway and pedestrian safety; noise, dust and general nuisance to local residents of nearby villages; potential to exacerbate localised flooding; impact on the character and quality of the local landscape; potential impact on natural water courses; potential impact on local farming activities; and potential impact on MOD movements/activities in the immediate area.
2. Please could you have regard to all the consultation responses/objections and accompanying documents, including traffic assessment by AXIS, that have been received directly to Richmondshire District Council (RDC). Some of these documents have been sent directly to NYCC Planning Control, but many of them appear to have only been sent to RDC. All of these documents can be viewed through the following Public Access link:

3. Comments have also been received from the North Yorkshire Local Access Forum (regarding highway safety) and from the NYCC Public Rights of Way Officer, which can also be viewed using the above public access link.
4. The proposed diverted PROW appears to cover much steeper ground than the existing PROW which could be to the detriment of walkers and other users of the route.
