Hello, with regard to the above planning application I would like to register my objections.

1. Noise caused by the drilling 24/7.
2. Flaring will cause a release of toxic fumes and unpleasant smell.
3. This application is incongruous with government policy, why remove new licences for North sea oil and gas then allow this application on land where there is greater potential for environmental damage and damage to people's health and safety. With further economic damage to an area dependent on tourism.
4. As our oil and gas production reduces, so also is our projected requirement for gas. In short we don't need this gas.
5. The gas produced will not reduce our gas bills. It will however make money for the parent energy company. Money going overseas to an unethical American company.
6. Earth tremors causing possible land slip which added to the fault running from Ravenscar through our beautiful heritage coast worries me irreparable damage could occur. There are many examples where hydraulic fracturing has cause land slip. Places like Groningen in the Netherlands where seismic activity has caused damage to buildings and infrastructure.
7. The drilling will run under SSSI where we have a delicate eco system with hundreds of species all being put at risk by noise atmosphere and water pollution.
8. Damage to tourism and so the local economy is inevitable. Thousands of HGVS carrying potentially toxic waste on what are already busy roads. Accidents do happen as a retired firefighter I have seen many. Why take these risks that we don't need to?
9. Possible contamination of our water courses. And in particular those who rely on wells for their supply.
10. Wells may run dry as the fracturing can cause water to drain deeper underground to fill the cavities left behind. Europa recon the geology will prevent this but if they are so sure of this why do they need a test rig at all?
