I wish to voice my objections to the proposed drilling for gas at Burniston, near Scarborough which will also affect Cloughton and Scalby

- The drill site is in general far too close to the village and specifically too close to actual properties – surely a less intrusive site could be used?
- The possibility of the destruction of valuable farmland
- The possibility of further development in particular the possibility of 4 further rigs
- The proximity of the site to already unstable cliffs and possible problems
- The proximity to the National Park – tourism and an area of outstanding natural beauty
- The possible devastating effect on tourism on which the area is highly dependent and the possible loss of income to local businesses
- The ruination of the countryside; damage to wildlife and birdlife especially in an SSSI area
- Deafening drilling, dust and light pollution 24/7
- Toxic fumes and nasty smells – offensive and dangerous emissions
- The strong possibility of damage to our precious water supply
